Dear Ms. Parker: I write to express my intent in authoring Assembly Bill (AB) 1305 related to voluntary carbon offsets. AB 1305 will impose disclosure obligations on certain covered entities that operate in California and make certain claims regarding their climate objectives. While the bill does not specify the date on which the first set of disclosures must be posted to a company's internet website, it was my intent that the first annual disclosure be posted by January 1, 2025. This deadline provides reporting entities with sufficient time to align their business practices with the stated objectives of AB 1305 prior to being subject to potential civil fines.

Thank you for the opportunity to clarify the intent of AB 1305.
